









## **REGIONAL OVERVIEW**

In 2024, food security remained a critical need for refugees and migrants in Latin America and the Caribbean. According to the RMNA 2024, **42% of the population faces critical levels of food insecurity**, driven by factors such as unemployment, unstable incomes and the rising cost of food. In the region, many people face severe food insecurity, prioritize access to food or even reduce their meals and go days without food due to high living costs and limited job opportunities. The magnitude of this crisis highlights the **urgency of interventions to ensure access to adequate food.**
